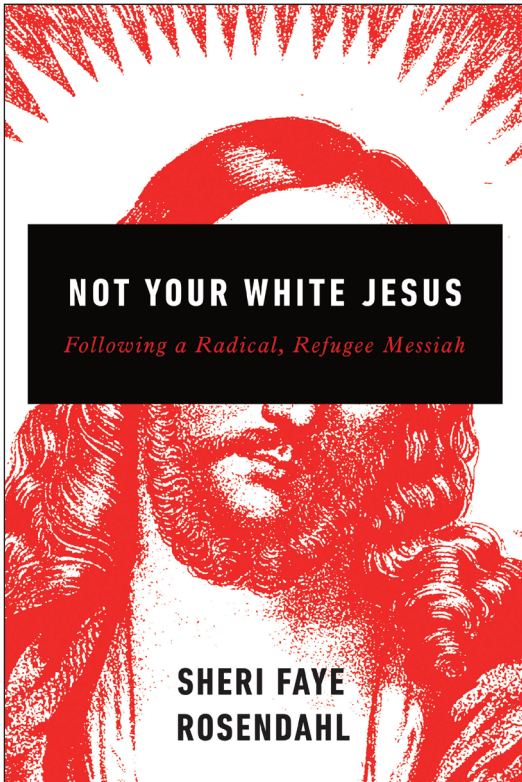


Book Club Questions for Sheri Faye Rosendahl's *Not Your White Jesus*
