
## Book Club Questions for Kira Schlesinger's *Pro-Choice and Christian*



Are you more comfortable with the term "pro-choice" or "pro-life"? In what ways are these labels helpful? In what ways are they divisive?

What impact do you think attitudes toward women have had on beliefs and policies about abortion? How do you feel about church and policies on abortion, contraception, and women's health in general being made by men?

What moral link, if any, do you see between contraception and abortion? Does the "slippery slope" from contraception and abortion to eugenics seem like a real risk to you?

What social changes do you think most affect women's choices regarding their fertility? How should these social changes influence the church's attitude and our nation's laws on abortion?

In general, how does Scripture shape your views on moral questions? How does the Bible provide insight for modern issues and decision making?

What kind of separation is there between your personal beliefs on the morality of abortion and the likelihood of your choosing it for yourself, and a belief in others' freedom of choice and compassionate understanding?

Imagine you are witness to a heated discussion between someone who insists abortion in every case is murder and someone who believes abortion on demand is an essential right. How could you help establish some common ground in the discussion?
